Application to Attend Cursillo

Cursillo is a world-wide movement of the Church, which is introduced by one diocese to another at the invitation of the Bishop. The Movement began in Spain in the late 1940's and has spread around the world. It was brought to Australia, to the Anglican Diocese of Canberra/Goulburn in 1979 from Canada and has spread to 18 other dioceses and to New Zealand. It was introduced to the Diocese of Tasmania from the Diocese of Gippsland in 1995.

At Cursillo, there is an atmosphere of joy with singing, laughter, times of silence and reflection, Eucharist, talks, discussions, and creative activities interspersed with prayer.

Cursillo is a 'short course / experience in Christian living', but it doesn't end with the conclusion of the three days.

The experience is maintained through small regular group meetings, diocesan gatherings, and individual prayer and study, which focus on living out one's faith. Ask your sponsor about the post-Cursillo programme.
